2018 - 2019 PBSD Redistricting/Realignment FAQs

- 1. Where will my child go to school next year? When will I find out?
 - a. Pending Board approval of the plan, Davis Demographics Company will run projections. As soon as we receive this information, we will notify all 2018 - 2019
 Kindergarten - fourth grade parents by mail. These students will attend either Pivik or Center.
 - b. All 2018 2019 Grade 5 and 6 students will attend Holiday Park Elementary
- 2. Will the start and end times of the school day change?
 - a. Yes. By May 1, 2018 start-end times for each building will be announced
- 3. As a parent, can I be involved in the transition?
 - a. Yes. Parent Advisory Committees will be created in those buildings affected by the reconfiguration and/or redistricting.
 - b. Invitations to join the committee will be made available to all parents/guardians.
- 4. How can the reconfiguration and redistricting be completed by the first day of the 2018-2019 school year?
 - a. Planning for the transition will begin immediately upon the Board approval.
 - b. District administration has a timeline in place already, based on the District's last two redistricting efforts.
 - c. Advisory teams will be created and begin to work immediately.
- 5. Will there be orientations and/or transitions nights available for each of the schools with parents and students impacted by the change?
 - a. Parent orientations will be held in each of the buildings in May, 2018
 - b. Student orientations will be held in each of the buildings in August, 2018
- 6. When will elementary students know of their 2018-2019 homeroom teacher assignment?
 - As is district previous practice, parents will be able to log into Sapphire Parent Portal August 2018
- 7. When will students be notified of assigned bus stop / bus number?
 - a. As is district previous practice, assigned bus stops and bus numbers will be available August 2018 via the Bus Stop Locator (district web page)
- 8. During the summer of 2018, will buildings be open for students to walk through
 - a. During August 2018, each building will have a specific date-time for students/parents to participate with self-guided building walk through.

- 9. What if my child has special needs? Will schools be aware of this?
 - a. Any student with an IEP, 504, etc. will be part of the transition team meetings
 - b. All necessary information as well as any assigned teacher case manager will be aware of students.
- 10. What will my child's day look like at the K-4 Buildings? 5 6 Building?
 - a. Information will be shared during Spring 2018 parent orientation and Summer 2018 student orientation
- 11. Will there still be a Sixth Grade Washington DC Trip?
 - a. Yes. Holiday Park Elementary School will work with PTA to coordinate.
- 12. How will the PTA's be organized?
 - a. As soon as attendance zones are created and assignments are made, PTA's will need to reorganize based on assignments.
- 13. Why is the K 4, 5 6, 7- 8, 9 12 model the best educational model for Plum?
 - a. The educational impact on 3700+ students will allow for maximization of district resources in providing a safe, positive, and productive learning experience for all students.
- 14. What are solutions for parents of ½ Kindergarten students (AM/PM)?
 - a. Mid-day transportation will be provided
 - b. Currently, working on providing list of options to all kindergarten parents
- 15. Can parents pick which section (AM/PM) for their kindergarten student?
 - a. Information will be shared during Kindergarten Orientation on May 1st, 6:00 PM at OBlock Jr. High.
